*Victorian Cities Revisited: Heritage and History Conference* seeks to explore the legacy of Asa Briggs' landmark *Victorian Cities* by considering how the heritage and history sectors have explored and revised perceptions of this period of vast urban transformation, both in the United Kingdom and across the globe.

In partnership with the University of Huddersfield, *Victorian Cities Revisited* is part of the £2.6m Heritage Lottery Fund supported Tees Transporter Bridge Visitor Experience Project. The Conference will take place in the Victorian boom town of Middlesbrough on 15-16<sup>th</sup> October 2014 and includes optional visits to a number of heritage sites in the town including the landmark Tees Transporter Bridge.

The organisers invite proposals for papers of 20 minutes on any aspect of the heritage and history of the Victorian City including but not limited to:

- Changing perceptions of Victorian Cities
- Spaces and places in Victorian Cities
- Living and working in the Victorian City
- Elites in the Victorian City
- Victorian Cities, heritage and museums
- Resources for researching Victorian Cities
